In Memory of Gloria Jean Christiansen - with many thanks to TGC member Irene Koziel for sharing the sad news

The following information was obtained from Gloria Christiansen's online obituary which was published on Legacy.com on January 11, 2024.

Gloria Christiansen was president of the Troy Garden Club from 1981-1983, when the TGC was still very young.

Born in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, she grew up in Hopelawn, NJ, on the same street where many of her aunts, uncles and cousins were neighbors. She is survived by her sister Patricia (Patsy), son Davin, daughter Denise Werner and five grandchildren.

As teenagers, Gloria and Patsy sang together with their best friend Esther in a trio called *The Stenos*. Following high school graduation, Gloria worked as a secretary and married Eric. In 1978, they moved from Kinnelon, NJ to Troy, where they raised their children.

Gloria's interests included art, antiques, tennis, golf, bowling, aerobics, cooking and, of course, gardening. While a Troy resident, she worked at Modern Vending, Inc., and later was a hostess and manager at The Terrace Club, a restaurant in the Palace of Auburn Hills. She resided in Royal Oak for 30 years beginning in 1989. Following retirement, she pursued many interests and especially enjoyed caring for dogs and cats. When her health declined, she moved to South Lyon to be closer to her daughter.

After suffering a stroke, Gloria was cared for at Cambrian Senior Living for three years. Her passing on January 10, 2024, was peaceful. Funeral services were held on Saturday, January 20, at O'Brien Sullivan Funeral Home in Novi. Charitable contributions in Gloria's memory are welcome, and they may be sent to The Michigan Humane Society.



From Barb Lepri: Did you receive a Christmas Cactus for the holidays?


Member Pat Piejak did, and she got some growing tips from Telly's. The plants prefer cooler areas of the house and bright light. To promote blooms at Christmas, beginning in September, (1) provide cooler temps: 60 - 65; (2) stop fertilizing; and (3) allow soil to dry. Provide 12 hours of darkness each night until mid-October. When buds appear, resume normal watering, keeping the soil evenly but lightly moist, providing high light and feeding the plant well. Osmocote is good.



Each yearbook will be labeled with a member's name. The documents will again be placed on the table in alphabetical order.


Please keep in mind that each member has already received a white binder in which to place annual updated year-book pages.

King Basil & Queen Rosemary



Basil . . . king of the herbs! (Rosemary is the queen.)





To grow it well, here's what you need to know: Basil likes warmth to grow. It loves temperatures in the 80s & 90s to thrive, and no lower than 50 degrees F.



Basil is a leaf crop, so it requires more moisture than other herbs. Too much, however, is deadly. If your basil is dark green and growing well, but the leaves are tough, the plant needs more water. If your plants turn yellow, give them fertilizer. If the stalks become woody and stop producing, cut plants back by one third and apply compost or fertilizer.

A good way to preserve your basil leaves is to place them in the compartments of an ice cube tray. Cover with water and freeze for future use. Just add to sauces or stews.
