

Herb Study






Our group met at the Troy Public Library on 11/19. We did our planning for 2026 and then Onita Fitz gave a report on Sorrel. There are two kinds of sorrel commonly grown as herbs: the English and the French. The English has large long pointed bright green leaves. The French variety has smaller round leaves that are more flavorful. The Buckler leaf sorrel has a milder, lemony zest which is preferred by the French for sorrel soup. French sorrel grows easily from seed sown outdoors in mid Spring. Sun or a little shade and a moist, but well drained soil are preferable. Sorrel can grow 2 to 4 feet tall. Later, Jennifer Goldstein showed us how to make mittens out of wool that's been boiled and shrunk! A full day!




Trick or Treat Wrap-up
